The annual MDG Awards support and raise awareness of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). The New Yorkbased ceremony provides a high profile platform to honour and celebrate exemplary efforts by select national governments and civil society stakeholders in contributing towards the achievement of the MDGs.

The theme for this year's ceremony is 'the MDGs: the Global Heartbeat'. A series of compelling stories will illustrate the power and impact of the MDGs and their potential to transform lives. The event will encourage distinguished guests, entertainers and celebrity speakers alike to voice their own personal commitment to supporting the MDGs while recognising the need for all stakeholders to work towards their achievement.

The Awards this year will be held on the eve of the MDG Summit at UN Headquarters to produce an agreed action agenda for the next five years. The Summit will serve as a crucial opportunity to mobilise all sectors of society – national governments, business, the philanthropic community and civil society at large – in a call to action for the big push to 2015.

The criteria for the nomination and selection of MDG Award winners will focus on initiatives that represent outstanding contributions toward attainment of the MDGs based on such factors as innovation, leadership, collaboration, impact, scale, and potential for transferability. Nominations will be made in consultation with a range of experts from within and outside the UN system who are closely involved in monitoring the status of MDG implementation.

Awards will be made in the following categories:

Government

Awards will be given for outstanding achievement in seven out of eight of the MDG categories. Preference will be given to Least Developed Countries.

Lifetime Achievement

The 2010 awards will recognise lifetime achievement in the categories of philanthropy, science and gender equality.

Recognition for Outstanding Youth Leadership

The nomination process will be lead by prominent youth organisations.

Stand Up Mobilisation

Awards will be given for outstanding achievement in organising participation in the "Stand Up and Take Action" mobilisation in support of the Millennium Development Goals. Recipient designated by UN Millennium Campaign, partners and Stand Up participants around the world.
