Population dynamics and women's bodily integrity;

While the relevance of gender equality and women's empowerment for sustainable development has long been established and recommended by governmental bodies, non-governmental organizations and many conferences, such as the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development, Rio de Janeiro, 3-14 June 1992, and the Beijing Declaration, Fourth World Conference on Women which took place in Beijing from 4 to 15 September 1995. It has therefore become increasingly evident that women's contributions to sustainable development are both undervalued and underutilized.

To illustrate, around 1.6 billion people worldwide continue to live without access to electricity. I call it energy poverty, particularly in rural areas and it is a major challenge in every dimension of people's lives. For example, more than 3 billion people heavily rely on open fires and traditional cooking stoves utilizing bio fuels and therefore we must highlight that advocating for equality and justice is not only essential for the benefit of future generations but also for our current ones too.

In most of the undeveloped world, the burden of securing food, water and fuel still largely falls on women and girls so this begs the question; how can economies be truly sustainable if the work that goes into it falls only on the shoulders of women?

To conclude, all of us women have to join forces and work harder to promote the United Nations principles and sustainable development goals (SDGs). This is a historic moment in which we have a unique opportunity to pave the way forward for our future generations by focusing particularly on UN SDG 4. This particular goal ensures inclusive and quality education for all and promotes lifelong learning. This is the foundation to improving people's lives and sustainable development.

In a similar vein, we have to make sure that to achieve gender equality and allow all women and girls to exercise their equal rights as per the UN SDG goal number 5, we must enforce their right by ending all forms of discrimination and violence and stopping the traditional practices of child marriages and female genital mutilation with the hope to include more women in peace building and security decision-making process.

Furthermore, we need to make certain reproductive rights as agreed in accordance with the International Conference on Population and Development and Beijing platform for Action and the national law are in place and last but not least to adopt sound policies and provide safe, peaceful, inclusive surroundings for all by enforcing legislations designed to promote gender equality around the world.

We are looking forward to making a significant impact in the coming years with the hope to meet the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.
