U.S. Federation for Middle East Peace Internship Program

The United States Federation for Middle East Peace (USFMEP) a non-profit, non-partisan organization promotes the United Nations commitment to international peace and justice through educational programs, public relations and community outreach efforts. USFMEP works to provide Americans with information about the Middle East - its history, religions, cultures and current issues. The goal is to promote understanding of the Middle East through seminars, workshops, roundtables, and public forums. We have established networks and liaison offices in other regions of the world to help raise awareness on issues concerning peace in the Middle East utilizing the latest methods in information technology.

The internship program offers a variety of positions of leadership development. It educates students on issues of Peace process, civil rights and the Arab heritage and current events in the Middle East, and empowers them to educate others. At the same time, students gain practical training in United Nations Procedures work, research and writing, media relations, legal issues, political action and educational work.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Candidates must be currently enrolled in college and have completed at least two years of undergraduate study or be enrolled in a graduate degree program. Prefer candidates with experience in any of the following: speech writing, fund-raising Grant writing and research.

SEMESTER INTERNSHIPS:

Volunteer positions for work-study or college credit are available during the academic year at the U.S. Federation for the Middle East Peace, and are arranged on a case-by-case basis. Interns will receive course credit for the three month program. During the school year, applications are considered on a rolling-basis. Work hours can be accommodated to the individual student's class schedule.
