The achievement to have people of faith realize their shared mission and agree that their devoted underlying tenants of their faiths are similar is a very important stride toward world peace.

Another precedent was set with a recent UN conference on Women from The Middle East, Europe and the United States (opposing cultures and religions) where Mrs. Kader facilitated the sharing of values and integrity. Similarly was a USFMEP s Conference e on family values which was well attended and pointed out the fabric of how there are interwoven threads that affect the future of us all.

The USFMEP has and continues to fight for women's' issues. In less than a decade the USFMEP has seen its affect of dialoguing on the attitude of women, raising self-esteem and enabling women to raise their status through education and determination to have the right that they are entitled to have.

Mrs. Kader has brought global attention to human trafficking crimes and put pressure on those who have kept it in the dark. The USFMEP has also exposed abuse of children and unpublicized war crimes. Through its widely attended conferences, this exposure has promoted global assistance.
